We believe in creating opportunities that allow these students to develop their careers, build meaningful connections, and experience all that the Netherlands has to offer.

02 The Challenges International Students Face

1. Financial Stability

96% of students work part-time to enhance their financial security.

Financial stability is a critical concern for international students, many of whom must balance the costs of living with their academic commitments.

For many, these jobs are not just about making ends meet—they are essential for affording basic necessities and participating in the rich cultural life of the Netherlands.



2. Building Routine

95% of students reported that their part-time jobs helped them establish a better weekly routine.

Maintaining a structured weekly routine is vital for student success. Our survey found that

This routine not only supports their academic performance but also enhances their time management skills, allowing them to balance work, study, and personal life more effectively.

KEY INSIGHT

Regular employment helps students develop strong time management skills, which 90% of respondents indicated as a factor in their increased productivity.

KEY INSIGHT

Part-time work is crucial for financial independence, with 37% of respondents citing significant improvement in their financial situation thanks to their employment.





3. Building Social Networks

92% of students stating that forming new social networks was a key motivation for their employment.

Social integration is a significant aspect of the international student experience. Part-time work provides a platform for building professional and personal relationships. These connections are crucial for creating a sense of belonging and easing the transition into Dutch life.

KEY INSIGHT

The opportunity to build a social and professional network is a primary driver for part-time work, with 77% of students seeing their networks expand significantly as a result.

4. Enhancing Productivity

90% of students in our survey reported that **balancing a job with their studies increased their overall productivity.**

Working while studying can be challenging, but it can also enhance productivity. By engaging in work that complements their academic pursuits, students learn to prioritize tasks and manage their time more effectively.

KEY INSIGHT

Balancing work and study leads to better time management, which 95% of respondents credited with helping them establish a more effective weekly routine.





5. Combating Loneliness

85% of students state that their jobs helped them feel more connected to others.

For many international students, the transition to a new country can be isolating. Part-time work helps alleviate feelings of loneliness, The social interactions that come with employment are critical in building a support system and integrating into the community.

KEY INSIGHT

Employment plays a significant role in reducing feelings of isolation, contributing to the overall well-being of 85% of students.

6. Developing Skills and Preparing for the Future

64% of students reported that their jobs helped them acquire new skills that will be valuable in their future careers. Additionally, 74% see these roles as a way to enhance their CVs, making them more competitive in the job market.

Part-time jobs are not just a means to an end; they are opportunities for professional development.

KEY INSIGHT

Skill development is a critical outcome of part-time work, with 64% of respondents noting the acquisition of new, valuable skills.



Challenges working students are facing


On the first edition of the survey which was conducted last year, working students stated that they were having challenges at work. This includes **language barrier**, workplace's distance that is too far and the **unavailable public transport** due to irregular working hours.

How we contribute on solving the issues

- 1. **Discounts** on Swapfiets products were introduced this year as a benefit for employees to reach workplace faster and easier with ebikes
- 2. To tackle language barriers, we have **encouraged students to start learning Dutch language** as an investment for their long-term plan in the Netherlands. We partnered up with a language institution to make this happen. Working students get to access up to 30% discount for beginner & advance courses with Piece of Dutch.
- 3. **Guidance** after students find work has always been our core activity and to ensure that the students are well-informed, we curated & introduced a Handbook for all of our employees to get onboarded via ISW.



Collaborations with +30 local companies

We have increased our effort in expanding partnerships outside Nijmegen in the past year. In result, we built collaborations with over 30 local companies in major student cities like Eindhoven, Nijmegen, Arnhem. Amsterdam, and Rotterdam. These partnerships have opened doors for international students to secure parttime employment while providing Dutch businesses with access to a diverse pool of international talent.



2. Long-term integration into Dutch society





3. Advocating International Students' Skills & Talent

ISW plays a crucial role in advocating for the capabilities of international students, particularly in **reducing barriers to employment.** Numerous of international students are in the Netherlands to stay long-term. ISW plays a role in unlocking opportunities for international students.

Our efforts have been instrumental in helping local businesses hire their first international students, setting a precedent for more inclusive hiring practices.



In effort to reduce barrier and workload of the employers, ISW made hiring internationals easier by assisting companies with work permit applications and navigating bureaucratic processes after students secure a job.

Challenges and Future Directions

While we are proud of the progress we have made, we recognise that there are still challenges to be addressed. Here's how we plan to tackle them:

1. Overcoming Language Barriers

Language remains a significant barrier for many international students. While English is widely spoken, mastering Dutch is often necessary for deeper integration into the workplace and society. We are actively exploring solutions to this challenge, including offering more language learning resources and encouraging workplaces to be more accommodating of non-Dutch speakers.

KEY INSIGHT

Language barriers are a persistent challenge, with many students expressing a need for more support in learning Dutch, particularly for workplace communication.



2. Expansions Jobs and Workshops

As we continue to grow, we are committed to enhancing our community engagement efforts. This includes improving our group chats, which 10% of students rated as needina improvement, and organising more events that bring students together to share experiences and support each other.

KEY INSIGHT

There is a need to foster a stronger sense of community among students, with plans to enhance social and professional networking opportunities.





3. Enhancing Financial Support and Compensation

We are constantly working to improve the financial compensation offered to our students. This involves advocating for fair wages and better working conditions, as well as providing resources that help students manage their finances more effectively. We have also expanded and started offering students help with mobility, insurance and banking to ensure they are thriving.

KEY INSIGHT

Financial stability is a top priority, and we are exploring ways to ensure that our students are adequately compensated for their work.
